First Sunday of Lent

Gospel Mk 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan.

He was among wild beasts,

and the angels ministered to him.

After John had been arrested,
Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God:
"This is the time of fulfillment.
The kingdom of God is at hand.
Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Ash Wednesday is the Beginning of the Holy Season of Lent preparing us to celebrate the Easter Resurrection. Just as Jesus fasted for 40 days in the desert; we are called to fast and pray for 40 days during Lent.

During Lent we practice: Fasting, Penance and Alms Giving.

Fasting – We put forth effort to discipline ourselves to do something to honor God. By giving up Candy of limiting computer time we establish God as our top priority.

Penance – We Pray to turn our hearts back to God helps us move towards a more holy future. It is a way to sacrifice to focus of God

Almsgiving - We take some of the money we did not spend of ourselves to gift someone else OR we donate the use of our time and talents to help someone else. (Some people use the CRS Rice Bowl to collect Money all during Lent and then donate the total after Easter.)

A Covenant

First Reading Gn 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him:

that were with you and came out of the ark.
I will establish my covenant with you,
that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed
by the waters of a flood;
there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth."

"This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you:
I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth.
When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds,
I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."
